



## BALLOT BOND LANGUAGE & VOTING

**Q** What is “Bond Language”?

**A** Sets the scope of work, on the ballots, for voters.

**Q** How does the community vote?

**A** All ballots will be mailed to the District’s registered voters. If you are not registered to vote, you will need to be registered by **April 4th, 2022** to receive a ballot in the mail.

**Q** When will ballots be sent out to the voters?

**A** Ballots for this election will be mailed to voters on **April 14th, 2022**.

**Q** What if I am only in the Elementary District?

**A** You will only receive **ONE** ballot for the Elementary portion of the bond, which has been set at **\$ 6,060,000**.

**Q** What if one bond passes and one does not?

**A** The project will **NOT** proceed forward. Improving the existing facility and building a new Middle & High School is dependent on the combined funding of **BOTH** districts. If **BOTH** bonds aren’t successful, then the project will not move forward.

**Q** Has the “Bond Language” been set for these projects?

**A** Yes, it was approved unanimously at a special School Board meeting in February.

**Q** How can I vote if I register after April 4th, 2022?

**A** After April 4th, anyone wanting to register will need to do so at the county election office in Columbus, MT. Once registered, voters can obtain ballots at the School District office.

**Q** What if I am in **BOTH** the Elementary & High School District?

**A** You will receive **TWO** ballots. One for the Elementary portion of the bond, which has been set at **\$ 6,060,000**, and the other for the High School portion of the ballot, which has been set at **\$ 10,685,000**.

**Q** When will the results be counted?

**A** On election day **May 3rd, 2022**.

Shall the Board of Trustees of Elementary School District No. 5 (Park City), Stillwater County, Montana (the “Elementary School District”), be authorized to sell and issue general obligation school building bonds of the Elementary School District in one or more series in the total principal amount of up to Six Million Sixty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$6,060,000.00), bearing interest at rates to be determined at the time of the sale, payable semiannually, during a term as to each series of bonds of not more than twenty-five (25) years, for the purpose of accommodating enrollment growth by paying the costs of converting the existing Park City school facilities to an elementary school by designing, constructing, renovating, furnishing and equipping various improvements, to include installing a new secure front entrance, remodeling the library entrance and bathrooms, remodeling the existing kitchen to serve as a warming kitchen, upgrading electrical, fire protection, and HVAC systems, site work and landscaping, and related improvements and costs; and paying a portion of the costs of designing, constructing, furnishing and equipping a new junior high and high school on land the High School District owns located at the corner of 4th Avenue SE and 2nd Street SE in Park City, to include classrooms, offices, a gymnasium and locker rooms, a career agricultural/technical education center, site work such as roads, utilities, landscaping and parking lots, and related improvements and costs; and paying the costs associated with the sale and issuance of the bonds?
